

In 2017 we implemented online Adoration sign-in software Adoration Pro which has allowed for easier management of adorers and the ability to monitor individual adorer activity.

## DID YOU KNOW?

We've been improving our communication

with you! Since the **new**website went live last fall,
there were 51,800 visits
through June. We have
tripled our Facebook
reach from 554 likes to
1450 likes. We introduced
OLG eNews, a weekly email
newsletter and, during the
fiscal year, 42 eNews
emails were sent out to
2000+ subscribers.



Every weekend over 120 parishioners help with our Liturgies as Sacristans, Altar Servers, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Lectors, Cantors, Choir and Greeters.

We added additional Meals on Wheels routes – on a daily basis we service 6 routes of between 8 and 11 elderly shut-ins.



It takes 12-15 volunteers and approximately 50 service hours to serve a funeral lunch:
4-5 volunteers to set-up,
8-10 volunteers for clean-up. Almost 2500 hours of service were provided last fiscal year.

As part of our Design for Learning initiative, **35** classrooms at OLG School and JPII Prep were completely retrofitted with new learning -centered class furniture financed entirely through OLG generosity.

Through our parish school and outreach efforts at JPII Prep and in Ghana, more than 1,700 students are recieving a Catholic faithbased education.

We increased our **Pro-Life** presence through:

- a new **Dignity of Life Committee**
- hosting tables at the ABRIA and Cradle of Life benefits
- having a strong presence at the ABRIA's Family Fun Run and 5K
- hosting a **Birth Mother's Retreat** for women who chose life and surrendered their children to adoptive parents
- having a group of HS teens and chaperones attend with Fr. Kevin the **March for Life** in Washington, DC.



Six **Boy Scouts** and two adults completed a **50 mile hiking trek** at the Philmont Scout Reservation in New Mexico

Five OLG Life Scouts are working towards their Eagle award.



Dear Friends,

Fiscal year 2017 was a good year for Our Lady of Grace as the steady growth that we experienced in 2016 continued. The following results reflect what occurred for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017.

From a financial results perspective, we were able to end fiscal year 2017 with a "Net Ordinary Income Surplus." The "Ordinary" income results are a reflection of how we manage our "day-to-day" operations. At a summary level, the revenues collected from all ministries were better than our projected budget. We experienced an 8% increase in school revenue that was in part due to the fundraising for the schools new "Design for Learning" initiative. Those funds were immediately invested in the furniture and equipment to support that initiative, which increased our expenses in the school ministry. Additionally we also had a 7.25% increase in "collection revenue" over the budget. It is this "collection" revenue that funds many of our ministries and pays for the day-to-day operating expenses of the parish. We are very thankful for your continued financial support, and we are hopeful that we can continue this positive trend. The "ordinary" net operating results showed a nominal "surplus" against the fiscal year budget.

In addition to a surplus in the day-to-day financial performance of the parish and school, we are also able to report a surplus in "Net Income" after "Other" income and expenses. Included in the "Other" income and expenses are items like gains and losses on our parish investment accounts held at Catholic Community Foundation (CCF) and any special gifts we received over the course of the fiscal year as well. Nearly all of the special gifts received by the parish and school were targeted for specific improvements on the parish campus and school classrooms. The amounts invested in CCF funds are held for long-term purposes, and we are pleased to inform all constituents of our ministries that the parish did not liquidate any investments for operating purposes.

As we indicated last year, we have spent considerable time and energy growing our three endowments (School, Parish, and Cassidy). The endowments are very important to the long-term financial future of our parish and school. We

were blessed to receive gifts to the endowments that went directly into the endowment funds at Catholic Community Foundation (CCF). In addition to these outright gifts, the investment market(s) performed well and our endowments performance "mirrored" the overall performance of the markets.

The beautiful mission statement of Our Lady of Grace is: "To Make Jesus Christ Known and Loved". This mission cannot be lived out without first understanding at a deep and personal level that everything we have is a gift from God and, as such, we should try to express our gratitude to God for those gifts. We are so grateful to the parishioners of Our Lady of Grace who demonstrate a consistent commitment to God and Our Lady of Grace through gifts of their prayer, service and tithe.

In closing, we remain committed to operating the finances of our parish in a "balanced" way so as to maintain your trust. We ask you to recommit yourselves to this beautiful faith community as well. Please prayerfully consider making a new or increasing financial commitment to allow us to continue to build a bright, Christ-filled future for Our Lady of Grace and for all those we serve. Please help us continue to live our parish mission: "To Make Jesus Christ Known and Loved." We depend on your committed financial support.


